B) Out patient Department (O.P.D.)

Paediatrics OPD is situated on ground Floor of Koyana Building. It is distributed over 5 room and 1 immunisation room .

- 1) Professor/Head of unit
- 2) Associate Professor Room
- 3) Assistant Professor
- 4) Resident & Interns
- 5) Clinic Room with 25 Student Sitting Capacity.
- 6) Immunization Room

In addition to routine and emergency pediatric care and health education following special activities are conducted.

Feeding room is provided separately isolated for breast feeding mother.

C) Child Guidance Clinic

This is carried out on every Wednesday and assesment done daily. The concept of CGC and working pattern is as follows.

Child Guidance clinic is the concept that has originated in the first decade of 20th century in USA. Originally it was concerned with care of delinquent children who can't adjust or who have behavior problems. Child Guidance Clinics deal with all children or adolescents who for one reason or other, are not fully adjusted to their environment. The object of child guidance is to prevent children

from the possibility of becoming neurotics & psychotics in later life.

Child Guidance Clinic is a team comprising of Pediatrician, Clinical Psychologist, Psychiatric Social Worker, Public Health Nurse, Speech Therapist, Occupational Therapist.

Methods used include parent counseling, play therapy, The psychologist is the central figure & is helped by others in arising at a correct diagnosis & formulating the line of treatment. The core therapy is psychotherapy in order to restore positive feelings of security in the child. The pediatrician takes care of physical health of child. Child Guidance Clinic operates on the presumption that if sound foundations of mental health are laid in childhood & adolescence, the same will continue into adulthood.

D) High risk Newborn clinic

This activity is carried out once weekly on Wednesday. The concept of neurology clinic and working pattern is as follows.

High risk neonates are prone to develop various kinds of physical and neurological deficit later on. If this handicap is detected early and timely interventions are done then the final deficit can be limited. Approx. 5000 deliveries are conducted every year in this institute out of which around 25% babies are high risk babies. Under this clinical activity babies with extreme prematurity, birth asphyxia, LBW, meningitis, septicemia, jaundice and who were on prolonged ventilator care are called for follow up. These babies are examined in detail for physical & mental handicap. If required these babies are investigated. Inter department specialist consultation are taken. Timely interventions, whenever required, are done.

E) Well baby clinic / Immunization and Child Welfare Clinic. (C.W.C.)

This activity is carried on every Monday, Wednesday & Friday. All babies are examined by a pediatrician before immunization. All babies receive UIP immunization free of cost. On Monday & Friday BCG, OPV & DPT vaccines are given and on Wednesday measles vaccine is given along with Vit. A dose. Immunization cards are distributed to beneficiaries. This activity is carried by Pediatrics and PSM department together. In CWC growth monitoring of children is done. Defaulters are picked up early. Nutritional advice and if required medication are prescribed to them.

F) SPECIALITY CLINIC :

Various pediatric speciality clinics conducted as availability of specialist in our department as follows:

- Pediatric Nephrology Clinic : Dr Shishir Mirgunde
- Pediatric Gastroenterology clinic: Dr Bhushan Miraje
- Pediatric Neurology clinic : Dr Manjunath Awadkhan
- Pediatric Cardiology clinic : Dr Maheshwari Jadhav
- Pediatric Asthma clinic : Dr Neelam Belekar

INDOOR FACILITIES :

I) General Pediatrics Wards

Total 100 beds are allotted for pediatric patients. These beds are located on 3 floors of Koyna Building. Patients are arranged in ward as per the Unit.

In the ward following rooms are available.

- 1) Side laboratory adjacent to wards where microscope and dipsticks and spirit lamp with test tube holder is available for emergency investigations that are done by residents.
- 2) Clinic room near to ward on 2 Floor where undergraduate and postgraduate academic activities are conducted. 25 students can be accommodated at a time for teaching activities.
- 3) Two Doctor's room one on 1st Floor and the other on Second Floor where on call resident doctors are available round the clock.
- 4) Along with nursing station, pantry, store room facilities are also available.

II) PICU

10 Bedded Pediatrics Intensive Care Unit with well equipped instruments is available. It is located adjacent to general pediatric ward. Critically sick children requiring intensive monitoring are shifted to PICU. Round the clock residents and nursing staff are available.

- ABG facility is available.

PICU and NICU is equipped with Central Oxygen and Suction facility is available .

- I) Critically sick children poisoning cases, acute renal failure, GBS, Snake bite, status epilepticus, status asthmatics are common cases treated here with reasonably good success.
- II) Since separate pediatric surgical unit is not functioning at present, post- operative pediatric surgical cases are jointly managed in PICU by pediatricians & pediatric surgeons.
- III) Paediatrics Peritoneal dialysis for acute Renal failure is being routinely practiced in our PICU Haemodialysis for chronic renal failure is also carried out at Haemodialysis unit in this department of Medicine.

III) NICU (INBORN NICU AND OUTBORN NICU)

Total 20 bedded with radiant warmer Neonatal Intensive Care Unit in which 10 bedded Inborn NICU for neonates delivered in our hospital is available on 2nd floor of Gyn-Ob complex building and 10 bedded outborn NICU at Koyana building for outside delivered neonates. Considering larger number of deliveries occurring in this institute and significant number usually occupied. Resident doctors and trained Nursing staff is available round the clock. NICU is provided with equipment's like radiant warmers, phototherapy units, infusion pumps, CPAP and dedicated neonatal ventilators pulse oximeters. Procedures like exchange transfusion are carried out. There is one separate breast feeding room where mothers are called to breastfeed their babies which are in NICU. Regular health education activities are carried out in this room where apart from problems in breastfeeding, importance of prevention of hypothermia and infections and care of low birth weight babies are discussed with mothers.

Doctors and nursing staff actively participate in these activities. Mothers are encouraged to participate in nursing care so that health education of mothers and early discharge from hospital becomes possible. High risk babies from NICU are followed up in Early Intervention Clinic.

KMC – Kangaroo Mother Care is also practiced in NICU. This makes mothers more aware about care of newborn. Early discharge from NICU is possible.

High risk screen and follow up done in neonates. Patients screened for ROP and OAE in indicated patients. Patients with congenital anomalies are referred to RBSK for further care and evaluation.

OTHER ACTIVITIES :

1) Health Camps

Various Diagnostic Camps are conducted at district and Taluka levels to render specialists' services to the rural population. These camps are mainly arranged by District Health Officer and carried out twice in a month. Patients screened through these camps who requires tertiary level management are called to the medical college on specific days in a week.

School Health programs are also carried out twice in a year in which primary school going students are checked by P.H.C. Doctors. Students requiring further secondary or tertiary management are referred to rural hospitals or Medical College respectively. These students are provided with well documented health cards which are kept with the school principal.

2) Breast Feeding Week

Every year from 1st Aug to 7th Aug is celebrated as Breast Feeding week. In this week, various educational programs regarding promotion of breast feeding are carried out in Medical College and CPR Hospital. The theme and slogan is used according to 'WHO' for that year. Staff nurses and student nurses are included in this program for better outcome. Seminars, panel discussions, quiz contests

regarding Breast feeding and Rangoli exhibition competitions are few of these programs. Sometime seminar or workshop conducted during this week.

3) National Nutrition Week

Every year 1st September to 7th September period is celebrated as National Nutrition Week. In this week lectures regarding Nutrition and Balanced diet are arranged for high school students to make them aware about ideal nutritious diet for that age group. Nutritious recipe competitions are carried out amongst nurses and they are awarded for it.

4) WHO Day (World Health Organization Day)

Every year 7th April is celebrated as W.H.O. day. According to theme of W.H.O. the programs are arranged in the form of rally, road shows and health camps. Dean and Civil Surgeon guide students, nurses and Para-medical staff for these celebrations.

5) ORS Day

29TH of July is celebrated as ORS day every year. On this day importance of Oral Rehydration Therapy is explained to mothers in O.P.D. with the help of audiovisual display. Methods of preparation of ORS is explained and demonstrated to them. Essay competition about ORS is conducted for undergraduates students. Dean and Civil Surgeons guide students about the same. In the O.P.D. ORS register is maintained.

6) Contribution to IAP and NNF activities

From this institution staff members of pediatric department actively participate as executive board members in various activities of Indian Academy of Pediatrics and also National Neonatology forum. Indian academy pediatrics undergraduate and post graduates quiz are arranged by our department.

7) AFP Surveillance and PULSE POLIO Campaign

All staff members from Dept. of Pediatrics actively participate in pulse polio campaign right from the beginning. They are involved in publicity, health education, supervision of booths and also work as district level supervisors for urban areas in the district. Nursing staff distributes polio doses to beneficiaries.








Since 1997 this hospital is recognized as AFP reporting center. Weekly reporting of AFP cases is done to District Immunization Officer. All cases from Pediatrics Orthopedics and Neurology department with acute onset flaccid paralysis are reported as AFP cases. Two stool samples 24 hours apart are sent to National Institute of Virology at Pune. Senior pediatrician from Dept. of Pediatrics monitors this activity. Out of all the AFP cases that are reported from entire district 75% cases are reported from this institution.
